

MACCLESFIELD BIKE SHOW

In a year where COVID has closed down many events, some never to return, Battunga Country Lions also considered not running the bike show but it's not in their nature to give up in the face of a challenge so it ran for 2020 and we are very pleased it did.

The weather in the week before the event wasn't too flash with low temperatures and rain but on Sunday November 1st the clouds cleared to reveal a beautiful sunny day at 25°C, which was just perfect.



A few traders and visitors camped out the night before at the oval to be sure of prime spots and the Lions kicked off at 6.30am to welcome traders at 7.30am and visitors at 9am. By 7.30am the Lions had the bacon and eggs ready and the Men's Shed were lining up the coffee to be followed by the Footy Club canteen and the Cricket Club bar.

At 9 o'clock it was on with bikes rolling in through the gate and parking up on the field, proving the drainage system at Maccy oval will always keep the turf springy and ready to support heavy bikes.

COVID regulations meant there could only be a maximum of 1000 visitors at the show at any time, not including the people running the show, so they were counted in and counted out. Then the bikes really started to pour in through the gate and capacity was reached by about 11.30am so they were stacked up at the entrance waiting for a space to come available. Luckily many bike riders drop into the show as part of their Sunday morning ride and carry on after checking out the swap-meet and grabbing some food and drink so spaces became available and more were allowed in.

The marshals on the in gate were calling the out gate on the radios to keep tally and carefully balance out the numbers.

Many of the bike riders decided to check out the town as they waited for a space and the main street was packed with an increase in trade for the pubs, the shop, and the market helped by Mount Barker Council providing funds to buy vouchers to be spent in the town.



Phil Cotter built the stage for the event and bands Crossfire, Rock Solid, Midnight Shift, and Stonehenge were pumping out the tunes through Brenton Firth's PA for the whole day.

Regular announcements had to be made throughout, under COVID rules, and Crash Carpenter from Hills FM did a guest spot as announcer for the day to make sure everyone stayed 1.5m apart,

used the hand sanitiser and didn't dance (COVID rules are very clear on dancing).

Battunga Country Lions is quite a small club and almost all of them are required to run the sizzle so they are helped out by the members of Williams Syndrome SA who provide all of the marshals on the gates for the day. The two clubs have worked together since the Gravfest and they make a great team.

At 2pm the winners of best British, American, Italian, Japanese, German, and alternative bikes were announced and the proud owners collected a certificate and a bottle of wine before the field began to clear.

By 3pm it was all over for another year and everyone was on their way home after a great day for the town. The Lions policy of only asking clubs based at the oval to provide catering puts a bit of pressure on the members to keep up with demand but you can't move the canteen, bar, and men's shed so the show comes to them.



By the end of the day 2,095 visitors had passed through the event and that's a lot of sausages, eggs, bacon, coffee, pies, chips, and beer as well as loads of parts sold in the swap-meet. Our own Edgar showed up with a trailer full of old bike parts and had a very good day turning them into cash.

Macclesfield can be very proud of the show as riders come a long way to visit and it has become one of the most talked about recommended bike shows in the state. It is put together by the Lions Club but it wouldn't be possible without the support of Mount Barker District Council, Shannon's Insurance, Harley Davidson Bike Works, Bleasdale Vineyard, Williams Syndrome SA, the footy club, the cricket club, the men's shed, the CFS, Phil, Crash, Brenton, and a lot of volunteers who pitched in to welcome the visitors.

The show is always on the first Sunday in November so next year it will be on the 7th.

Glimpses of the Past



The Macclesfield Strawberry Fete

This year marks the 93rd anniversary of the Macclesfield Strawberry Fete, which evolved from the 'All British Fair', held in 1927 as a St John's Church of England fundraiser. The new St John's Church in Venables Street was completed in 1926 and in September of that year, St John's Church of England Guild of Women was formed to undertake the entire furnishing of their new Church. They were a very busy band of women who held social afternoons and euchre dances throughout the summer and by March 1927 it was reported that the furnishings including a new organ and had cost 116 pounds and 19 shillings, only a portion of which was still owing.

It was then decided to hold the 'All British Fair' on November 23rd 1927 with strawberries and cream to be sold and other stalls conducted. The fair was a great success and that same year the ladies also ran a stall at the Congregational Church's Christmas Eve Fair. In those days Father Christmas arrived in Macclesfield on Christmas Eve and was welcomed at the Fair by the Congregational Church, later joined by the Methodist Church, and later still, conducted entirely by the Methodist Church.

The Church of England Fete continued annually and usually in November, but sometimes early December depending on when strawberries were available. During the early 1930's a dance was sometimes held in lieu, but always with strawberries and cream and cool drinks etc. being sold. In 1934 the Fete was held and the Sunday School boys provided side shows as well as the usual entertainment. In 1936 it was held in the daytime with a dance at night and that successful arrangement continued for many years as one of the social highlights of life in Macclesfield.

The Hall was always beautifully decorated and much planning went into the various stalls and themes. The floral arrangements on the stage, were a focal point as the Fete was opened, with the official party seated there and a small girl chosen from the Sunday School to present a gift and posy of flowers to whoever had the honour of performing the ceremony.

Older 'Maccyites' will remember the lucky dips in the baker's oven with the attendants in baker's garb and later the 'tulip garden', where a flower was selected and pulled out to reveal the dip attached to the stem. Those attendants were also dressed in flower costumes with the theme changing each year. One year's report mentioned an 'Orange and Lemon tree' instead of a 'Bran Pie' for lucky dips.

There were always competitions at the Fete. During one year it was the final of the Ugly Man competition, other years, guess the name of the doll, with the doll being the prize, or guess the weight of the cake and win the cake.

In later years 'The Pick a Box' stall was extremely popular, the shapes and labels on the parcels giving no clue to their contents and everyone loved the surprise. It seems that Father Christmas made his first appearance at the Fete in 1959 (perhaps that was the year the Christmas Eve Fair was discontinued). Now days Father Christmas arrives at 'Carols on the Square', a combined Church event.

The dance at night was dropped in 1970 and in 1987 the members of the Anglican Church invited other local churches to take part in the Fete. This was a successful move and continued until 1991 when the Community Association was invited to sponsor the day and invite other local groups to participate. A Bush Dance was also introduced and was very popular with young and old alike.

As with any successful and enduring event the ability to change with changing times ensures growth and continuity. The Macclesfield Strawberry Fete is no exception. From its very early beginnings as a Church fund raiser, till now its 93rd anniversary, the Fete has continued to uphold its important social event status.


In recent years the emphasis has turned to that of a country market. As Macclesfield embraces the wine industry even more options present themselves.

Meeting 19/10/20

What has your community association been up to and what are they planning for you?

The eastern side of Venables Street upgrade

A few members of the MCA had a most reassuring meeting with Josh Teague concerning the proposed upgrade to Venables Street and are optimistically looking forward to some action soon.

The MCA have suggested some changes to the Council's proposed upgrade and we hope to share these with the community once the plans have been finalised

Once we have the finalised plans we will seek community endorsement to take to Council so keep an eye on these developments

Maccy Mates Mental Health First Aid training

The MCA has organised training for 14 individuals from 8 Macclesfield groups/clubs/organisations to attend a weekend workshop on Mental Health First Aid training on November 7^{th} and 8^{th} in the Institute. The idea is to have these people trained so that they can recognise symptoms of poor mental health in individuals in order to help the sufferer seek assistance. With 14 local people trained we will be able to support each other in times of need.

Davenport Square shelter furniture

The Maccy Men's Shed is currently working on preparing a table and bench seats, similar to the ones found in the BBQ shelter, to instal in the playground shelter. This furniture was purchased by the MCA from Steve Gardner using a MBDC grant.

Healthy Towns Challenge

Background work in the future development of a walking trail, exercise stations and native gardens in and around Davenport Square has commenced with support from a local environment landscape designer, the Maccy Bushcare group and the Council. Observers may be seen jotting down information on who currently uses the park and how so that this information can be compared with data collected after the project is completed.

Online Hall bookings

Christie is currently working with Council to set up an online booking system for the Institute so if you are looking to organise an event in the future keep an eye on this space. In the meantime bookings can be made by contacting Robyn on 0438 806 631.

Lots of little jobs have been undertaken and completed recently. Thank you Ashley White for doing the electrical testing and tagging of all MCA equipment, the hole in the floor of the hall has been repaired, a bug zapper has been purchased for the kitchen/supper room area and we're expecting the History Club compactus to be installed soon.

South Ward Alliance

Members from the three South Ward towns' community associations, Macclesfield, Echunga and Meadows, recently met to discuss issues pertinent to all 3 towns. It was no surprise to learn that all of us are disappointed with the amount of funding support we receive from Council despite the South Ward having 16% of the region's population. It was decided that a united approach to Council, through a deputation, seeking a more equitable distribution of Council funds in its annual budget and business plan, is the groups' first action.
